
Our Annual Adventures

Coming out of a pandemic presented challenges for our partnership. Increasing the frequency of cross-border professional communications and continuing virtual partner exchange was essential. We discovered just how resilient our team and committees truly are during times of crisis. Moving forward, we are planning several in-person group and individual exchanges, which thrills our staff and partners and provides light and even greater hope for our future.

Our 2022 Strategy

Growing our partnership with universities has created opportunities for college students to develop professionally and contribute to local conservation at a meaningful level.

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A major goal of the 2021-2022 school year was to amplify our outreach, restoration, and education efforts in the Portland Metro area. To accomplish this expansion, we hired a new program coordinator to recruit additional metro-area schools and maintain alignment with Portland State University's Louis Stokes Alliance for Minority Participation program (LSMP) to develop climate resilience internships for college students.

An ongoing goal for the partnership is to continue our international partner exchanges between the Willamette and Rio Laja. By building stronger relationships with plant nurseries and educators, we are preparing to plan another exchange in June 2023.





2021-2022 ACOMPLISHMENTS



Youth outdoor learning	Students grew gardens, participated in habitat restoration, and studied birds using binoculars.
Water Catchment	Diagnostic data for the water captivation system at Justo Sierra. Prep site for the water captivation system and filter additions.
Cultural exchanges	Students wrote letters, drew maps of North America, and exchanged videos and photos with their pen pals.
World Migratory Bird Day	Partnered with groups locally in the Willamette and Laja basins to promote outreach for families related bird observation and raising awareness for the challenges that migratory birds face.
University of Oregon	Partnered with the Environmental Leadership program to develop service learning projects for college students. Students gained experience creating lessons and implementing outdoor education for elementary students.
